

# Apple Health and Medicaid

## What is Apple Health?

Apple Health is Washington's Medicaid program. It allows families who would not otherwise be able to afford health insurance to receive it for free. If enrolled in Apple Health, healthcare is covered by one of five MCOs.

## What are MCOs?

Managed care organizations, or MCOs, are responsible for providing for the health care needs of individuals or families that are covered by Apple Health or private insurance. The MCOs that are contracted with Apple Health to provide Medicaid in Washington are Amerigroup Washington, Community Health Plan of Washington, Coordinated Care of Washington, Molina Healthcare of Washington, and UnitedHealthcare Community Plan. Apple Health recipients are able to view the benefits of each of these MCOs and choose the one that best suits them.

## What are the requirements to get Apple Health?

- That your annual household income is at or below the Medicaid standard (see below).
- You are a U.S. citizen or meet Medicaid immigration requirements.
- You are not entitled to Medicare.

## What can I do if I get a renewal notice or are un-enrolled from Apple Health Coverage?

Medicaid expanded their coverage during the COVID 19 Health Emergency. Now that it's over, some people who were covered by Medicaid over the last few years, no longer qualify. Apple Health is sending out renewal notices to millions of enrollees asking for proof of eligibility under the new requirements. Respond to these promptly to avoid being un-enrolled in Apple Health.
